Dear California Department of Pesticide Regulation (DPR),

As a 2-time cancer survivor, I urge you to adopt the California Office of Environmental Health Hazard Assessment (OEHHA) "safe harbor levels" of 1,3-dichloropropene (aka 1,3-D or brand name Telone) at 0.04 parts per billion for regulatory purposes in Monterey and Santa Cruz counties.

An average daily air concentration below 0.56 parts per billion is not acceptable as it exposes schoolchildren, families, and people in general to levels above the safe harbor levels. Value human life and health in your regulatory practices.
