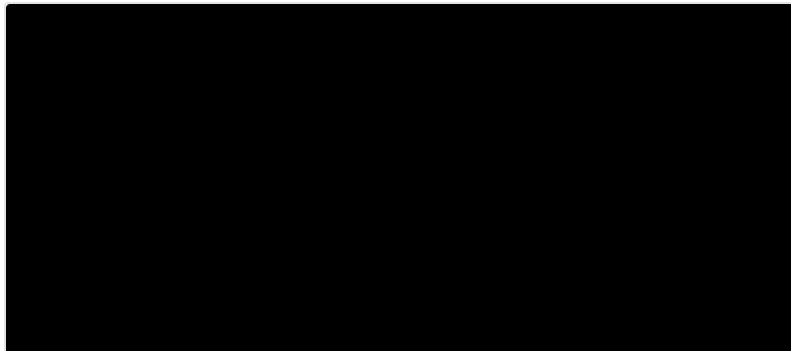

To whom it may concern:

1,3-D fumigant must be regulated to keep the public (especially school children) safe from breathing 0.04 parts per billion in the air. Farm working communities are largely Latino. The Pajaro school district alone is more than 90 % Latino. Thirty four countries have banned this pesticide. How can your Agency say that, "Treating people fairly guides how DPR conducts its activities. Fair treatment means that no one group of people including racial ethnic or socio economic groups, should be disproportionately affected by pesticides." A simple google search regarding the ethnicity in Santa Cruz and Monterey Counties will reveal that the majority of all farmworkers are Latino. I say this with 25 years of experience working with Watsonville, Salinas and Greenfield farmworkers as a social worker. Using this pesticide specifically targets one ethnic group. Simple research also discusses how far fumigants can drift.
