Thank you for the information.

The alterations do not take into consideration the danger to the people that live in the community near the farms. The adjustments and application parameters are still not safe. Consider the fact that 1,3-D (Telone) is a banned pesticide in 34 countries because of its cancer causing dangers to human health. The use of it in the Pajaro and Salinas Valleys is a serious danger to our communities. It is also regularly used in Monterey and Santa Cruz counties, and still you are proposing a level that is 14x higher than levels that the OEHHA has said is safe. (Many countries care for their citizens enough to ban it entirely.) Again, this is a matter of deep concern that there is such inequity with the levels that the DPR is willing to expose farmworkers and communities with a high level of Latinos living there. Think about the children! This is still a horrendous proposal and my community needs at least the protections that the rest of California is entitled to. I wish it was banned entirely. Consider the health of the people, not the corporations' push for profits. There are other ways to successfully grow food!

Please eliminate the use of this pesticide.

The Department of Pesticide Regulation (DPR) is proposing changes to the regulations that were publicly noticed on November 18, 2022 concerning health risk mitigation and volatile organic compound emission reduction for 1,3-dichloropropene. Additionally, DPR is adding “Documents Relied Upon” to the rulemaking file.

The 15-day comment period will begin on May 9, 2023 and end at 5:00 p.m. on May 31, 2023. A public hearing will be held in a hybrid format on May 31, 2023 to receive oral and/or written comments on the proposed modifications.
